INSTITUTIONAL ETHICS COMMITTEE REGULATIONS

ASSAM DOWN TOWN UNIVERSITY

RULES & REGULATIONS OF ETHICS COMMITTEE:

AIM:

The aim of institutional Ethics Committee of regulations of Assam down town University is to make research beneficial to the society without creating any social problem to the society/individual.

OBJECTIVE:

The basic ethical principles are autonomy, justice, beneficence and non-maleficence for society. The ethical principles are to assess the risk-benefit ratio of the clinical trial so that results can be generalized and extrapolated to the population.

Formation of Ethics Committee:-

1. The ethics committee should have a minimum seven (7) members and maximum fifteen (15) members which includes a chairperson (independent of an institute or outside the institution), one member secretary, clinicians (medical & scientific), legal expert, social scientist and layperson.
2. For clearing the protocol for a clinical trial, the ethics committee should have the quorum of at least five members: Basic scientist, legal expert, clinician, social scientist and layperson.
3. The principal investigator and the Ethical Committee members are expected to have adequate knowledge on Good Clinical Practice guidelines for clinical trials in India. Members representing ethics committee should have a postgraduate degree, possess sufficient scientific knowledge, and should be aware of their roles and responsibilities as board members.
4. There should be no conflict of interest while decision making on the research protocol from any of the committee members. All members should declare their conflict of interest.
5. The committee can invite specialist and experts in the case of discussion related to the topic of their expertise, but the invited experts will not have the right of voting.

Functions:-

1. Ethics committee will review the research protocols in clinical practice guidelines for clinical trial in India to safeguard the right, well being and safety of the trial participants.

2. In case any adverse event during the clinical trial, the ethics committee will analyse and give its opinion.
3. Ethics committee shall cooperate with the inspectors and officials authorized by the Central Drugs Standard Control Organization to enter its premises to inspect any record, data or any document related to clinical trial and provide adequate replies to any query.
4. The committee shall maintain all the information regarding the clinical trial for at least 5 years after the completion of the trial.
5. The ethics committee registration is valid for five (5) years. The committee members are approved by Vice Chancellor of the University. The V.C has the sole authority to cancel the committee or to alter the committee.

Activities of Ethics Committee:-

1. **The novelty of research and social value:** The study should add to the existing knowledge or should help in innovation for the new knowledge and should benefit the society and humanity by enlarge.
2. **Scientifically sound:** The research should be scientifically valid sound study design, appropriate statistical analysis, the feasibility of the study, and precise scientific objective.
3. **Fair selection of the study samples:** Selection of the vulnerable group for research with risky outcomes is a major ethical problem. Appropriate selection of the sample based on the merit of the study and justice to the sample is of most importance.
4. **Favorable risk-benefit ratio:** Maximum benefit and minimum risk care should be taken to have minimal risk to the patient in comparison to the benefit. The benefit is assessed on the total good from the research to the individual and the society. Patients should not be exploited.
5. **Independent review of the research protocol:** Review of the protocol for possible conflict of interest, the source of funding, and other financial details are to be thoroughly assessed. There should be review of research design of the trail and risk to the population recruited in the trial.
6. **Informed consent:** It should be taken from every sample recruited in the study; it should be voluntary, legal and comprehending and should be recorded and maintained as per regulations of the country.
7. **Respect for potential and enrolled participants in the study:** Autonomy of the participants involved in research is very crucial: the participants need to be informed of the risk and benefits involved in the trail, and they have the right to withdraw from the study at any given time.

The researchers and ethics committees have to keep track of the changes in the rules, regulations and amendments.

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Foreword

By Member Secretary of Ethics Committee Assam down town University

INTRODUCTION

These guidelines are intended to facilitate and support ethical review in all countries around the world. They are based on a close examination of the requirements for ethical review as established by International guidelines, as well as on an evaluation of existing practices of ethical review in countries around the world. They do not, however, purport to replace the need for national and local guidelines for the ethical review of academic research, nor do they intend to supersede national laws and regulations.

It is imperative that specific ethical guidelines be followed, to complement existing laws, regulation and practices, to serve as basis upon which the Institute ethics committee can develop specific written procedures for various academic researches. We have brought out a document on ethics committee, which apart from general principles on ethics, contains standard operating procedures for ethical review of various academic research protocols which are in the curriculum of different Bachelor, Master and PhD courses awarded by the University. It is expected that every supervisors and the students strictly follow the standard guidelines and address the ethical issues with utmost care. Works on human samples shall follow the norms and guidelines as per Indian Council of Medical Research.

As the member secretary of ethics committee, I take this opportunity to express my gratitude to our director, chairman and all the members of the expert committee for their valuable contributions at different levels.

Any study that involves living organism needs to follow standard protocol of the concerned field and needs to strictly monitor by a panel of experts. This has been a mandatory step and institutional ethics committees have been assigned important roles all over the world.

Dissertation/thesis/ survey or report has been introduced in the syllabus of almost all disciplines of sciences and in many branches of arts. These have been in the curriculum and are important for the award of degrees and diplomas. This needs preparation of project protocols by students under the supervision of concerned guide. Here comes the role of EC. The prime aim shall be to review and monitor such proposals prior, during and also after the completion of the project.

The scenario with respect to health care research is even more challenging as it involves human samples. Malpighi (1628-1694) was the first to observe that studies in lower animals could predict the effects in humans. This was further established by Claude Bernard (1813 - 1878) who pioneered the methods of animal experiments. However, an animal experiment cannot duplicate human conditions and has limitations. Therefore, to have valid conclusion applicable to humans, it is essential to evaluate new interventions in humans, and this ought to be done ethically.

In 1964, the eighteenth World Medical Assembly at Helsinki, Finland adopted a code of Ethics for the guidance of doctors involved in clinical research. This is popularly known as the "Declaration of Helsinki." However in 1975, the revised "Helsinki II" code was introduced, with major contributions from the Council for International Organizations of Medical Sciences (CIOMS) and the World Health Organization (WHO). Another revision was made in 1981, at Tokyo, Japan, considering the growth of clinical research activities in many technologically developing countries. The "Declaration of Helsinki" was revised at Venice, Italy, in 1983, and again at Hong Kong in 1989. The latest revision was made in October 1996 at the 48th General Assembly, Somerset West, Republic of South Africa, and this is now internationally followed by physicians conducting clinical research.

The concept of Good Clinical Practice (GCP) was first introduced in the United States of America in 1996 to protect the rights, safety and well being of the human subjects participating in clinical studies and to ensure credibility of the research findings. Although the concept of GCP was one, there were many versions in different countries. The European Union, the United States Food and Drug Administration (US FDA), the Nordic Countries and the World Health Organization (WHO) each had its own set of guidelines. It was therefore thought that a uniform code of ethics for human research should be followed all over the world to facilitate the

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acceptability of a study in several countries, and thus to avoid unnecessary duplication of studies.

Today, the ICH GCP guideline is followed globally for clinical research. This guideline elaborates the composition and functioning of an Institutional Ethics Committee to review clinical research proposals.

In India, Ethics Committee for research on Human Subjects presently functions according to the requirements laid down in Schedule Y and is guided by the ICH GCP guidelines for Good Clinical Practice, ethical principles set forth in the Declaration of Helsinki and the Ethical Guidelines for Biomedical Research on Human Subjects laid down by the Indian Council of Medical Research.



1. Name, Formation & Registration

This committee will be known as the **Ethics Committee, Assam down town University**. The Committee has been formed by Assam down town University ltd.

The business address for Ethics Committee Assam down town University is: **Assam down town University, Sankar Madhab Path, Gandhi Nagar, Panikhaiti, Guwahati-781026 (Assam)**

2. Objectives & Responsibility

The primary purpose of this Committee will be:

- 2.1. To protect the rights, safety and well being of the research subjects and assists in welfare and benefit of the society.
- 2.2. To review the qualifications of all investigators participating in the proposed research study.
- 2.3. To keep all information submitted to them confidential especially, the proprietary information.
- 2.4. To review all research proposals submitted to the Committee within the specified time limits.
- 2.5. To maintain concise but clear documentation of its views on the research proposals.
- 2.6. To review the progress of each research project at appropriate and specified intervals and also review the summary of final report of the studies approved by them.

3. Membership

3.1. Composition of the Committee

- 3.1.1. The regular members of the Committee will ideally include at least 7 and a maximum of 15 individuals as follows:
 - a) Medical Professional or Clinician
 - b) Basic Scientist(From Basic / Applied sciences)
 - c) A legal Expert



- d) A Social Worker/Representative of a Non-Governmental Organization /Theologian
 - e) A Lay Person from the Community
- 3.1.2. The Committee will have representation from both men and women.
- 3.1.3. All members will act in the manner independent of any influence of their existing relationship with any organization, institute or individual.

3.2. Chairperson

- 3.2.1. Prof. Annada Charan Bhagabati has been appointed as the Chairperson for Ethics Committee down town hospital who is invited by the Member Secretary for coming on board.
- 3.2.2. The Chairperson will be responsible for conducting all Committee meetings and will lead all discussions and deliberations pertinent to the review of research proposals.
- 3.2.3. The Chairperson will preside over all the matters pertinent to the Committee's functions.
- 3.2.4. In case of anticipated absence, the Chairperson will nominate a Committee Member as Acting Chairperson and documentation for the same will be maintained. The Acting Chairperson will have all the powers of the Chairperson for the respective meeting.

3.3. Member secretary

3.3.1. *Dr. S. Chandra, Principal DTCAHS*
~~The Chairman & Managing Director, Dr. N. N. Dutta, of the institution has appointed the Member Secretary.~~ *has been appointed as member Sec*

3.3.2. In consultation with the Chairperson, the Member Secretary will be responsible for the following functions:

- a) Inviting all the Committee members to come on board.
- b) Receiving all the research proposals.
- c) Forwarding all the documents to be reviewed to the Committee members.
- d) Preparation and dissemination of agenda for all Committee meetings Three (3) days or less than three (3) days prior to the meeting date as per 4.5.5
- e) Inviting special attendees from relevant therapeutic areas to the scheduled meetings, if needed.
- f) Maintenance of records Preparation and circulation of minutes (Within seven (7) working days from the date of the meeting).

- g) Notification of review outcome to Principal investigator or Sponsor or CRO of research proposals (Within seven (7) working days from the date of the meeting).
- h) Generate and dispatch review letters of respective research proposals.
- i) Retention and safekeeping of all records and documentation as described in 5 & 6 ((For a stipulated time).
- j) Performance of other duties assigned by the Chairperson.
- k) Administrative matters pertinent to the Committee's functions.
- l) Signing on behalf of the Chairperson, in consultation with the Chairperson.
- m) Doing all the communications on behalf of the Committee.

3.3.3 In case of anticipated absence of the Member Secretary, the Acting Member Secretary will be nominated by the Chairperson and/or the Member Secretary and documentation for the same will be maintained. The Acting Member Secretary will perform the duties of the Member Secretary and have all the powers of the Member Secretary for that meeting.

3.4 Members

3.4.1 The members will be selected and appointed by the Chairperson and the Member Secretary provided; they are willing to work as an Ethics Committee Member.

3.4.2 The period of membership will be five (5) years, or until they cease to be members either at their own request or by a decision of the other Committee members, whichever happens first.

3.4.3 New members will be appointed to replace members who have resigned or whose tenures of Membership have expired, according to the process described in 3.8.

3.4.4 Members should maintain confidentiality of all discussions during the meeting and sign a confidentiality agreement at the start of their term.

3.4.5 Conflict of Interest

- a) The Committee member with conflicting interest should accept the protocol for review. The same should be communicated to the Member Secretary/Chairperson/Committee.
- b) In case the member has conflict of interest for any protocol received for review, the member shall immediately inform Member Secretary/Chairperson/Committee well in advance of the scheduled meeting and withdraw from the meeting or withdraw



- from deliberation of that particular protocol. Another suitable member shall be invited to fulfill the quorum requirements.
- c) If Committee members need information on the study from the member with a conflicting interest, then the member may remain present in the meeting room during presentation of the study. The member must then leave the meeting room during the deliberative discussion and voting on the protocol.
 - d) The same will be recorded in the Declaration of Conflict of Interest Form (the template for the same is attached in Appendix II) AND Minutes of Meeting.

3.5 Conditions of Appointment

3.5.1. A member should be willing to publicize his/her full name, profession, and affiliation; all reimbursement for work and expenses, if any, within or related to the Committee as these details will be made available to the appropriate authority upon request.

3.5.2. A member should sign a confidentiality agreement regarding meeting deliberations, Applications, information on research participants, and related matters; in addition, all of the Committee administrative staff should sign a similar confidentiality agreement

3.6 Tenure of Membership

3.6.1. The tenure of Committee membership will be a continuous period of five (5) years.

3.6.2. Extension of membership will be decided by the institution.

3.6.3. There will be no limit to the number of times that membership can be extended.

3.7. Termination of Membership:

The membership will stand to be terminated under the following circumstances:

3.7.1. If a member resigns from the Committee.

3.7.2. If a member is incapable of performing his/her duty as the Committee member.

3.7.3. In case of demise of a member.

3.7.4. Rotation system for membership will be considered to allow for continuity, development and maintenance of expertise within the Committee and regular input of fresh ideas and approaches.

3.7.5. In case of resignation,

Any member may resign before completing their terms by writing their intention to the Chairperson.



3.8 Appointment of New Members

3.8.1 New members will be appointed under the following circumstances:

When a regular member completes his/her tenure

- a) If a regular member resigns or drops out before his tenure is completed.
- b) If a regular member is unavailable for more than 2 months without prior permission.
- c) If volume of proposals and frequency of review demands appointment of new members.

3.8.2. A new member shall be appointed from the same category as that of the member being replaced in case of member replacement.

3.9. Special Invitees

As appropriate, the Committee will decide the need for participation of qualified special invitees to have unbiased scientific and/or ethical opinion for the study protocol to be discussed. Special invitees shall participate in the discussion and deliberations, but will not vote on a research proposal. However, the opinion of the special invitee shall be recorded.

4. Functions & Operations

Submission of the Research Proposals

- 4.1.1. All communications with the Committee will be in writing (Physical or electronic).
- 4.1.2. The Committee will require the submission in Printed (member copies + 1 PI Reference copy (if required) + Guest Member copy (if any) & electronic copy (Whenever possible) of the study protocol as listed for every research proposal.
- 4.1.3. All the relevant revised documents which are resubmitted for review should be submitted in two copies (Committee reference copy + one copy) if the resubmission involves only those changes which are suggested by the Committee with no other modification.
- 4.1.4. In case of any amendment to the research proposal or any modification which is not suggested by the Committee and is not administrative, submission should be as directed in 4.1.3.
- 4.1.5. The academic research proposals submitted by students of the University shall be **free** of charges. However, the initial fee for the Ethics Committee shall be Rs. **10,000/** (Ten thousand rupees only) for government sponsored or any other sponsored projects.
- 4.1.6. The same would be payable at: "Assam down town University" by demand draft addressed to the **Chairman, EC, and AdtU.**

4.1.7. The documents required for submission are the following:

- a) Study proposal with covering letter.
- b) Protocol.
- c) Undertaking by Investigator.
- d) Available safety information, if any.
- e) Investigator's CV reflecting academic qualification and experience.
- f) A concise report on the practical application of the project on the society and mankind.

4.2.1 Procedure for Document Receipt & Handling:

4.2.1. Receiving the study Documents

The Member Secretary will receive the study documents and other related documents in hard copies at the Ethics Committee, Assam down town University office submitted by the Principal Investigator/students.

4.2.2. Checklist for Submitted Documents

The Member Secretary will check the following:

- a) A submission Letter addressing the Ethics Committee Assam down town University.
- b) Total number of copies of all documents.

4.2.3. Circulating the Documents.

- a) Study documents will be circulated to the members along with a Document Circulation Log to maintain the record of the same and the template of Document Circulation Log is attached as Appendix I.
- b) The Document Circulation Log will be filled by the person receiving the documents.
- c) After the documents have been circulated, Document Circulation Log will be checked for completeness and will be archived in master log file.

4.2.4 Return of the Documents

- a) On the meeting day, the members will bring their hard copies of the study documents to be reviewed.
- b) After taking the decision for the proposed study, the members return their copies at the office.
- c) All the returned copies will be discarded if not asked to be returned by the Investigator or students except for two copies, one Committee reference copy and one copy to be kept with the Chairperson.

- d) Out of the two copies, one committee reference copy will be archived at the committee office and the archival log will be updated accordingly and the second copy will be kept with the Chairperson.
- d) Archival will be done as described in Section 6.
- e) In case a member is not able to attend the meeting, it will be the member's responsibility to return the documents to the Committee.

4.3 Elements of Review

The submitted proposal shall be reviewed both for scientific content and ethical principles. The Committee members shall review the proposal with reference to the following:

- 4.3.1 Scientific design of the study
- 4.3.2 Justification/Rationale of the study
- 4.3.3 Potential benefits to the study subjects, predictable risks to the study subjects, if any.
- 4.3.4 Benefits to the society.

4.4 Criteria for the Approval of Research

4.4.1 In order to approve the research proposal, the Committee shall determine that all of the following requirements are satisfied:

- a) Risks to subjects, if any, are reasonable in relation to anticipated benefits. In evaluating risks and benefits, the Committee should consider only those risks and benefits that may result from the research.
- b) Selection of subject is equitable.
- c) Informed consent will be sought from each prospective subject or the Legally Authorized Representative of the subject in case of human samples.
- d) When appropriate, there are adequate provisions to protect the privacy of subjects and to maintain the confidentiality of data.
- h) The Committee shall have the authority to suspend or terminate approval of research that is not being conducted in accordance with the Committee's requirements. Any suspension or termination of approval shall include a statement of the reason/s for the Committee's action



and shall be reported promptly to the Investigator, appropriate Institutional officials, the department or agency head.

4.5 Meetings

4.5.1 The Committee will hold regular meetings, depending on the number of research proposals for review. However the Committee will meet at least once every six (6) weeks. The frequency of meeting may increase/ decrease depending on the schedule of semesters and initiation of projects under various courses.

4.5.2 A maximum of 25 proposals can be reviewed at each meeting.

4.5.3 The Member Secretary will check the availability of the members for the meeting and shall invite the members for the same accordingly.

4.5.4 Primary reviewer could be assigned by the Chairperson to conduct a detailed review of a research protocol and provide a report at the meeting.

4.5.5 All regular members will receive notification of meeting schedules at least three (3) days in advance.

4.5.6 The proposal may be sent to a subject expert for his/her assessment and opinion of the research proposal. The subject expert may be invited for the meeting if deemed necessary by the Committee.

4.5.7 The Investigator and/or Co-Investigator may be invited to the meeting to provide clarifications on the study protocol if deemed necessary by the Committee.

4.5.8 Specific patient group representatives may also be invited for the meeting based on the requirement of the research area if deemed necessary

4.5.9 Meeting will be held only if quorum is met. A quorum will be defined as a minimum of five (5) members including one basic scientist, one clinician, one legal expert, one social worker/representative of a non-governmental organization/theologian or a similar person, one lay person from the community.

4.5.10 Minutes

The proceedings of the meeting will be recorded in English and in form of minutes. The Member Secretary will be responsible for coordination, recording and circulation of the meeting minutes.



4.5.11 Decision Making

- a) Decision for each proposal/study shall be by individual member voting.
- b) All members present at the meeting will vote on the research proposal.
- c) The decision will not be declared until the consensus is reached amongst all the members regarding the opinion to the proposal/study under consideration.
- d) The queries, comments or suggestions from the member(s) not in favour of the approval, shall be forwarded to the Principal Investigator and reply received from their end will be discussed with members. After all the members are satisfied with the reply, the approval will be given. In case the member(s), are not satisfied with the reply, the Chairperson shall take the final decision regarding further action on the protocol depending on the opinion/decision which is favored by majority of the quorum members present at the meeting.
- e) Absent members will not have a right to vote. However, if absent members has been a part of the entire discussion via any electronic media form.
- f) Member(s) of the Committee who is/are listed as Investigator(s) on a research proposal and will not vote on the proposal.
- g) An Investigator or study team member invited for the meeting will not vote or participate in the decision making procedures of the Committee.
- h) Specific patient group representative invited for the meeting will not vote or participate in the decision making procedures of the Committee.
- i) The Committee shall reserve the right to withhold favorable opinion/approval on a research proposal when the Committee does not have reasonable assurance about the qualification of the Investigator(s) or the research proposal itself.
- j) The Committee shall notify the Investigator in writing of its decision to approve or disapprove the proposed research activity or of modifications required to secure the approval of the research activity. If the Committee decides to disapprove a research activity, it shall include in its written notification, a statement of the reasons for its decision and give the Investigator an opportunity to respond in person or in writing.

4.6 Review Outcome



The Committee will document its view as the following:

4.6.1 Approval- Unconditional or Conditional

4.6.2 Request for Modification or Information

4.6.3 Disapproval

4.6.4 Termination/Suspension of the research proposal/ongoing study

4.7 Notification of Review Outcome

The outcome of the Committee review will be recorded and conveyed to the Investigator within seven (7) working days from the date of review.

4.8 Approval Period

All projects will be given approval for a period of one year from the date on which the project was approved & for projects continuing for longer than one year annual renewal will be mandatory.

4.9 Procedures for Appeal after Protocol Rejection

For research proposals rejected by the Committee, the applicant may appeal for a repeat review in writing, within six (6) weeks of the receipt of the Committee's decision. While doing so, the applicant shall give justification relevant to the issues/objections raised by the Committee.

4.10 Amendments to the Approved Research Proposal & Informed Consent Documents

4.10.1 All amendments to the approved research proposal shall be submitted to the Committee immediately for its review as directed in 4.1.4 & 4.1.5.

4.11 Expedited Review Procedures

4.11.1 The Committee may use expedited review procedure in case of minor changes in the previously approved research.

4.11.2 Under an expedited review procedure, the review may be carried out by the Chairperson, or by one or more experienced reviewers designated by the Chairperson from amongst the members of the Committee. The reviewers may exercise all of the authorities of the Committee except that the reviewers may not disapprove the research.



4.11.3 An ongoing research activity may be disapproved only after review in accordance with non-expedited review procedure as mentioned. The members will be informed about the expedited review proposal in the next full board meeting.

4.11.4 Only the Chairperson shall make the decision to allow an expedited review.

4.12.1 The Investigator should promptly report the following to the Committee:

a) Deviations from or changes to the protocol to avoid immediate hazards to the trial subjects.

4.12.2 Annual Progress Report

For the study continuing for longer than the period of one year, the first report shall be submitted within thirty (30) days of completion of one year following the date of the first approval. Subsequent reports shall be submitted at one-year intervals following the first report.

5. Records Retention

The Committee will retain the following records:

5.1 Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs) in effect at the time of review and the previous SOPs.

5.2 Membership list at the time of review and the previous membership records.

5.3 Occupation/affiliations of the members at the time of review with CVs and training records of the members as well as CV of guest expert members.

5.4 Invitation letter, Consent Letter and CDA signed by members and guest expert members and Resignation Letters of the members who have resigned.

5.5 Agenda of meetings, minutes of meetings and all correspondence with the Principal Investigator.

5.6 Copies of all research proposals reviewed, scientific evaluations, if any, that accompany the proposals, progress reports submitted by the Investigators.

5.7 Applicable regulatory guidelines

5.8 Registration details of the Ethics Committee

These records will be made available to relevant regulatory authority upon request.

6. Archival Policy

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6.1 The Committee reference study documents and other related documents will be archived for five (5) years after the completion of the study. And after five (5) years, the respective Principal Investigators/departments will be informed about the end of archival period and the documents will be returned or discarded as instructed by the respective authority.

6.2 The Archival Log will be updated accordingly.

6.3 The documents will be archived within a secure place in a locked cupboard, with restricted access.

6.4 The documents of the completed study can be archived at a separate facility and the details for the same will be maintained in the archival log.

7. On-going Training of Members

7.1 The Chairperson will identify the training requirements of the Committee members.

7.2 The Chairperson and the Member Secretary will organize atleast one workshop or training program for the Committee members every year.

7.3 The type of programs, areas for training and mentors for these workshops/training programs will be decided by the Chairperson in consultation with the Committee members.

8. Reports to the Relevant Regulatory Authorities

The Committee will make a yearly activity report for submission to the relevant regulatory authorities upon request, which would include the following elements:

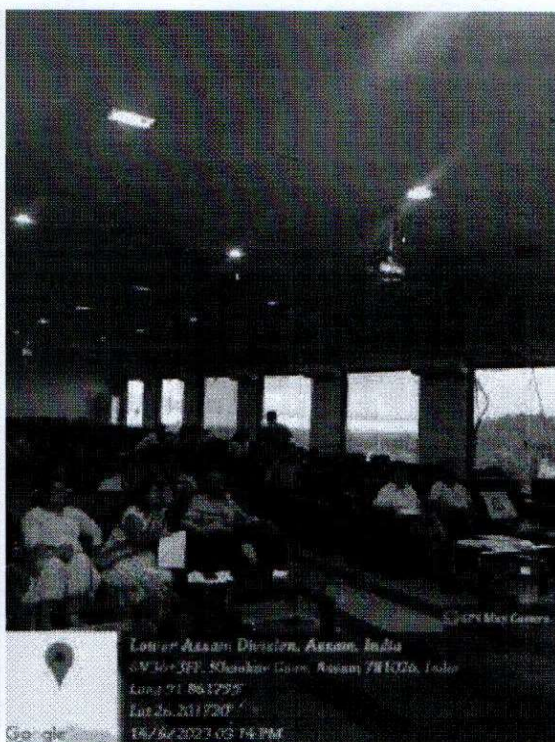
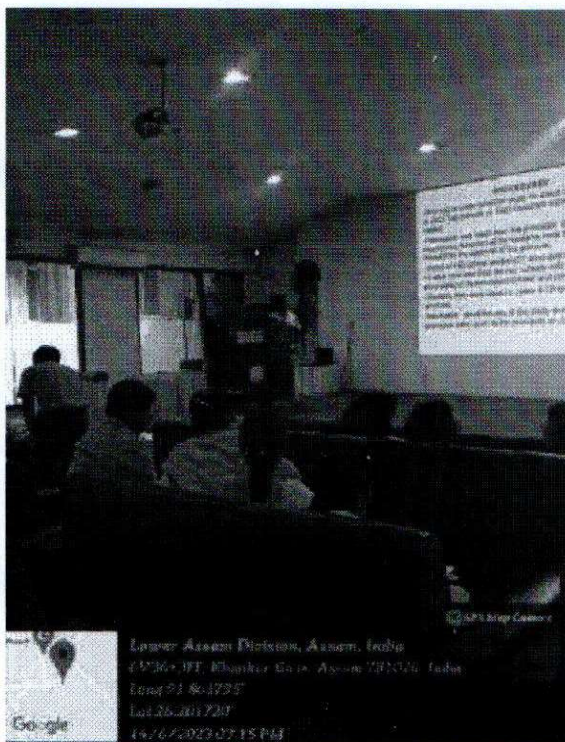
