3.3 - Innovation Ecosystem

3.3.1 - Institution has created an eco-system for innovations including Incubation centre and other initiatives for creation and transfer of knowledge

Assam down town University's innovation ecosystem, overseen by the Directorate of Innovation Startup and Acceleration, is a thriving space fostering entrepreneurship and supporting startups. Central to this ecosystem is the down Town Venture Labs Foundation (dtVL), a prominent incubation center established in 2015 and registered as a legal entity under Section 8 of the Indian Companies Act in July 2022. dtVL offers a range of incubation and pre-incubation programs aimed at nurturing innovation and entrepreneurial talent.

One of its flagship programs is the Technology Incubation and Development of Entrepreneurs (TIDE 2.0), sponsored by the Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology (MeitY), Government of India. TIDE 2.0 supports innovators and startups through two categories: Entrepreneur in Residence (EiR) and Grant. EiRs receive

a grant-in-aid of Rs. 4 lakhs for prototype development, while startups in the Grant category receive Rs. 7 lakhs to translate prototypes into Minimum Viable Products (MVPs).

Additionally, dtVL offers programs like dtVLiDEATION, providing incubation support and debt funding to selected startups, and Campus iDEATION, which supports innovative ideas from students of Assam down town University with financial aid for product development.

Mentorship plays a crucial role in dtVL's support system, helping startups refine strategies, navigate challenges, and accelerate growth. The impact of these initiatives is significant, with key achievements including incubating 10 startups, conducting 31 programs covering awareness building and training workshops, facilitating 10 Entrepreneurship Development Programs (EDPs) for students, adding 6 new mentors, creating over 60 jobs, establishing 9 collaborations, and raising over INR 50 lakhs in investments for incubated startups.

AdtU has implemented a waste management policy to effectively handle the various types of waste generated within its campus. For biodegradable solid waste, the university has established facilities such as vermicompost pits and a biogas plant. Additionally, leftover and edible food items are repurposed by feeding them to pigs and emu birds housed on campus. To manage non-biodegradable solid waste, AdtU has entered into an agreement with an NGO for its proper disposal. The campus is equipped with blue and green colored bins to encourage proper waste segregation. Liquid waste is managed through a network of toilets, washrooms, and lavatories, with waste directed through storm sewers and drains. Sewage storage tanks are strategically placed throughout the campus. Biomedical waste is handled according to policy, with red-colored bins positioned at designated locations and needle disposal machines installed in medical labs for safe disposal. E-waste disposal is managed through a memorandum of understanding (MOU) with a third party, with the university also promoting the concept of urban mining. The primary waste management system of AdtU revolves around its vermicompost and biogas plant facilities. Hazardous chemicals are treated before disposal into the campus sewer channels and wash drains, with no generation of radioactive waste occurring within the AdtU campus.
