Advances in CAR T-cell therapy for treating patients with mantle cell lymphoma: a critical appraisal

CAR T-cell (chimeric antigen receptor T-cell) has shown encouraging outcomes in the treatment of several cancers, including mantle cell lymphoma (MCL) that is a rare type of non-Hodgkin lymphoma (NHL) which begins in the lymph nodes. It is distinguished by cyclin D1 protein overexpression caused by a chromosomal translocation between the immunoglobulin heavy chain locus (IGH) and Cyclin D1 (CCND1) gene. In the case of MCL, excessive CCND1 is produced by B cells that are abnormal. Notably, CCND1 helps in the growth of B cells. Clinical characterization of MCL is done by its heterogeneity nature. The course of the disease ranges from indolent cases for which therapy is not essential for years to MCL that is highly aggressive in nature (requiring treatment), with the prognosis very limited. New targeted immunotherapy-based approaches, viz., CAR T-cell therapy, have already facilitated the improvement of the therapeutic options, particularly for the refractory or relapsing disease^[1].

occurring in nature is to target B cell antigens on the surface of the cells. This approach has provided scientists with significant responses in other cancers of B cells too.

In the ZUMA-2 study, patients suffering from relapsed or refractory MCL when given axicabtagene ciloleucel (axi-cel) (an example of autologous cell therapy), a CD19-targeted CAR T-cell treatment, had a high overall response rate (ORR) of 91% and a complete response (CR) rate of 68%. These results prompted the USFDA to approve axi-cel for treating relapsed or refractory MCL^[3]. The USFDA has also given approval to brexucabtagene autoleucel (brexu-cel/KTE-X19), a novel therapeutic approach involving CAR T cells. This therapy is particularly recommended for patients with MCL who have remained unresponsive to therapies previously or in the case of patients where the condition has relapsed. Approval has been given to this treatment on the basis of ZUMA-2 clinical trial outcome^[2]. Brexu-cel/KTE-X19 elicited

Abstract By 2025, the projected global obesity rates for both men and women are 18% and 21%, respectively. Obesity raises the risk of several comorbidities like cardiovascular disease, gastrointestinal disorders, type 2 diabetes, respiratory problems, and most importantly non-alcoholic fatty liver disease (NAFLD). NAFLD is commonly considered to be both a consequence and a contributor to metabolic dysfunctions such as obesity, given the liver's pivotal

with inflammation and DNL. Several research studies have provided evidence regarding the effectiveness and safety of plant derived bioactive compounds plants for managing obesity associated NAFLD. Several bioactive phytoconstituents like antein A, ginsenoside, naringenin, apigenin, silibinin, kaempferol have been identified as potential agents for improving obesity associated NAFLD by targeting the inflammatory and DNL pathways. The Inspiring Journey of Assam down town University (AdtU)

In the heart of the Northeast, overlooking the serene Brahmaputra River, stands Assam down town University (AdtU), a beacon of knowledge and progress. What began as a modest initiative in 1993 with the establishment of the down town School of Nursing has transformed into one of the most sought-after educational institutions in the region. The vision was clear—to create a hub of excellence that would nurture talent, uplift communities, and empower students from diverse backgrounds.

Humble Beginnings: The Seeds of a Dream

In 1993, the down town Charity Trust, promoted by down town Hospital Limited, took its first step into the field of education with the establishment of the down town School of Nursing, marking the first private nursing school in Northeast India. With a deep understanding of the region's healthcare needs, the group expanded its educational outreach by launching the Paramedical Institute in 1997, offering diplomas in various allied health disciplines. This was the stepping stone for what would become a grand vision for higher education in Assam.

A Vision for Growth: The Road to University Status

The Trust envisioned a full-fledged university that could offer a diverse range of programs beyond healthcare, including engineering, management, social sciences, and more. In 2009, they submitted a proposal to the Assam Government for recognition as University under the provisions of the Assam Private Universities Act, 2007.

Once upon a time, Assam down town University (AdtU) embarked on a mission to transform itself into a premier institution dedicated to academic excellence, research, and innovation. Over the years, through determination and strategic planning, the university has grown into a multidisciplinary educational hub, making significant strides in curriculum development, quality education, and global recognition.

Enhancing Academic Excellence: Implementation and Progress of Outcome Based Education at Assam down town University

The Assam down town University has implemented Outcome Based Education (OBE) along with Choice Based Credit System (CSCS) in the curricula. The Outcome Based Education is based upon goals or outcomes. By the end of the degree programme, each student is supposed to achieve the goal, that is set forth in the beginning. At each opportunity, be it inside the classrooms or in the recreational fields, an effort is made to help students achieve the specified outcomes.

The components of OBE are the Programme Outcomes (PO), Programme Specific Outcomes (PSO), and Course Outcomes (CO), whichare listed in the syllabus for each programmes, so that the desired outcome of each course and its desired impact on the Programme Outcome is evident all the time. The Programme Outcomes are statements about the knowledge, skills and attitudes (attributes) the graduate of a formal programme should attain. POs deal with the general aspect of graduation for a particular programme, and the competencies and expertise a graduate will possess after completion of the programme. These are broad guidelines and covers a wide area. The National Board of Accreditation (NBA) has set 12 Programme Outcomes, or Graduate Attributes for the sake of unity and quality assurance, which are taken into consideration while finalizing the POs. Similarly, each course has a set of pre-defined COs. Course outcomes are statements that define what students should be able to do and know at the end of a course and are generally closely follows the Blooms Taxonomy. A student is able to attain the Programme Outcome, if she/he is able to ideally attain the COs of all of the courses at the end of the programme. Programme Specific Outcomes (PSOs), on the other hand are statements that describe what graduates of a programme should be able to do after they graduate from the particular institution and may vary from programme to programme. Similarly, the Programme Educational Objectives (PEOs) are broad statements that describe the career and professional accomplishments that a programme prepares its graduates to achieve.

The COs, POs, PEOs and PSOs are finalized in the Programme Academic Committee (PAC) and the Board of Studies (BoS) at the time of syllabus preparation/revision taking into account any guideline provided by the statutory authorities like AICTE, PCI, etc. Once, the POs and COs are finalized, the faculty maps the COs with the POs based on the content of the course and the goal

envisaged in the POs. This is reviewed at various level, before the syllabi are submitted to the Academic Council for ratification and suggestions/recommendations of the Academic Council, if any, are incorporated in the final syllabus.

CO: PO Attainment: The final goal of the OBE system of education is to map the level of CO:PO attainment achieved at the end of a programme and to measure the degree of attainment achieved by the students' body after completing the programme. Based on the result of the attainment calculation, the syllabi or the delivery process is tuned so that future batches can achieve better attainment. The first step of CO: PO attainment is mapping the POs with the COs. Though all courses are part of a programme, all COs do not contribute equally to all the POs. Any particular CO may not contribute towards some POs, have mild contribution towards few POs and may contribute very significantly towards some other POs. A CO:PO mapping table is prepared and included in the Syllabus showing the relationship between the POs, PSOs of the programme and the COs of all the constituent courses.

For measuring the CO: PO attainment, the first step is to set the targets. Attainment is measured in both in direct and indirect way. Direct attainment measures the students' achievement in structured evaluation process like in-semester assessments and semester-end examination. Beforehand, a target is set (for example 60%, which is required to get 1st division in most examination can be the first target). The percentage of students scoring more than the targetis considered to have attained the target. Each question is mapped against the relevant CO and by association the relevant PO and as such the % of students achieving the POs and the PSOs is measured. Similarly indirect attainment is measured from the student survey conducted before the students exit the degree programme and by combining the score achieved in both direct attainment and indirect attainment in the pre-determined ratio is used to determine the level of attainment.

Challenges faced in CO:PO attainment:

The AdtU started measuring CO-PO attainment gradually from the batch of students that passed in 2022-23, as the previous year were severely impacted by the COVID pandemic. The first challenge faced was setting realistic targets. In the backdrop of the huge impact of COVID expectations of students doing very well was unrealistic. The second challenge again was an

outcome of COVID in the sense that because of the lockdowns imposed, the regular evaluation systems had to be shelved, and online examination was resorted too. This led to inconsistency in the examination system leading to difficulty in measuring the level of attainment in a consistent manner. Most of the faculty members being new to the system posed another challenge as they had to be first taught the process and the complexities involved, before the attainment process could be implemented. The results obtained for the 2022-23 passed-out batch were not very encouraging because of the huge impact of COVID on the whole academic system, but the data for the 2023-24 batches are looking to be promising and based on the attainment level adjustments in the curricula and syllabus is being attempted.

Student Admission Details for the Academic Year











Advancing Research Excellence at AdtU

In the academic year 2023-24, Assam down town University (AdtU) has undertaken significant initiatives to elevate its research ecosystem to new heights. Recognizing the pivotal role of faculty in driving innovation, the university has strategically revised its Research Award Policy to further incentivize and support high-impact research endeavors. To enhance research infrastructure, AdtU has introduced sophisticated instruments to the each Central Instrumentation Facility (CIF), ensuring access to cutting-edge technology for advanced experimentation and analysis. Additionally, substantial improvements have been made to laboratory infrastructure, creating a more conducive environment for groundbreaking research.

In a landmark move to support faculty-led innovation, AdtU has provided a significant seed grant for 28 faculty-driven projects, amounting to ₹87.49 lakhs. This funding aims to nurture pioneering research ideas and foster a culture of scientific inquiry. Moreover, AdtU is actively managing extramural research grants amounting to ₹1389.06 lakhs, secured through 7 prestigious grants from various government agencies, including the Department of Biotechnology (DBT), Department of Science & Technology (DST), Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR), and Assam Science Technology & Environment Council (ASTEC). These grants reflect the university's research excellence and its dedication to tackling contemporary scientific and societal challenges. Additionally, the university has successfully secured ₹89 lakhs from 25 non-government funding agencies, supporting 213 faculty-led projects across various disciplines.




Distribution of research funds received from various funding agencies during the current academic year.



Popular Lecture Series

Throughout the academic session, AdtU hosted a variety of lecture series, including the Popular Talk, Chancellor's Lecture Series, and Expert Talk Series, among others. These events were designed to engage students and faculty, providing them with valuable insights into ongoing research and developments happening globally. A few of the notable lectures are listed below.

Talk 1: Managing Forest Ecosystem in Kerala: An Overview

On 21st August 2023, the Faculty of Science, in collaboration with the Faculty of Agricultural Science and Technology, organized a popular talk titled "Managing Forest Ecosystem in the State of Kerala." Dr. Syam Viswanath, Director of the Kerala Forest Research Institute, delivered the lecture, providing an in-depth overview of Kerala's diverse forest ecosystems, including its geography, forest types, and rich biodiversity of plant and animal species.

The session highlighted key challenges, such as the impact of hydroelectric projects and forest fires, and mining, quarrying, infrastructure development, and tourism outside the forests. Dr. Viswanath also discussed the threats posed by land use changes in the Western Ghats, monoculture plantations, and invasive species.

His motivational discourse captivated the audience, sparking curiosity and enthusiasm among over 60 participants, including 30 faculty members from the University. Dr. Mout's expertise and passion for eliminating genetic diseases through innovative methodologies left a profound impact on students, faculty, and aspiring researchers. His insights into the future of New Age Medicine, where genetic ailments are addressed at their core, resonated deeply with the young minds present.

His infectious enthusiasm and profound insights left an indelible mark on the pursuit of knowledge at Assam down town University, fostering a renewed sense of excitement and inspiration for students and faculty alike.

Talk 3: Food and Nutritional Security in India with Special Reference to Assam

Assam down town University had the privilege of hosting Dr. H.S. Gupta, a renowned agricultural scientist and former Director of the Indian Agricultural Research Institute, for an insightful talk on the critical issue of food and nutritional security in India, with a special focus on Assam. Dr. Gupta's lecture addressed the challenges and opportunities faced by India in ensuring food security, especially in the context of rural livelihoods, climate change, population growth, and the impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic. Dr. Gupta discussed the significant progress India has made in expanding food production and building up safety stocks of food grains. However, he emphasized that food distribution, affordability, quality, and safety remain major concerns despite the country's self-sufficiency in food production. In particular, Assam, with its diverse agro-climatic and socio-cultural environment, faces unique challenges and opportunities in achieving food and nutritional security.

The talk mainly delivered into key factors influencing food availability, access, utilization, and stability in the state of Assam, including crop diversification, irrigation, market linkages, the public distribution system, dietary patterns, nutritional interventions, and disaster management. Dr. Gupta's extensive research and field experience provided valuable insights into the current status and trends in food and nutritional security in Assam. He also shared practical policy recommendations and best practices for enhancing food security in the region.

The session was highly informative and resonated with all attendees, including students, faculty, and others interested in food and nutrition issues in India and Assam. Dr. Gupta's expert perspective and recommendations on sustainable agricultural practices, nutrition, and disaster resilience inspired a deeper understanding of how food security can be achieved in the region, making the talk a significant contribution to the University's ongoing humble efforts to direct its resource for research and innovation in globally relevant issues.

Talk 4: Lecture on Plant Molecular Genomics

The Faculty of Science at Assam down town University organized a two-day guest lecture series on September 8th and 9th, 2023, for B.Sc. and M.Sc. 3rd and 5th semester students across various programs. Dr. Niranjan Chakraborty, a distinguished Professor from Jawaharlal Nehru University (JNU), New Delhi, was invited as the guest speaker for both days. The primary objective of these lectures was to introduce students to the field of plant molecular genomics, a key area of research in modern biology. The first session, held on September 8th, was attended by B.Sc. 5th semester students. Dr. Chakraborty began by providing a strong foundation in molecular biology and gradually transitioned into a detailed exploration of plant molecular genomics. He shared valuable insights from his own research, illustrating the application of theoretical knowledge in real-world scientific endeavors. His talk emphasized the importance of fundamental knowledge in pursuing a successful career in any scientific field. The session, lasting 120 minutes, concluded with Dr. Chakraborty encouraging students to actively participate in national and international competitive examinations.

On the second day, September 9th, the lecture was directed towards M.Sc. 3rd semester students. The session focused on the significance of competitive examinations such as CSIR-NET, GATE,

and ICMR-NET, and included an overview of molecular biology with a particular focus on plant genomics.




