Action to be taken to curb ragging in campus and hostels</li> </ol>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Discussed the need for strict implementation of anti-ragging policies and regulations.</li> <li>• Emphasized the importance of conducting regular surprise inspections in hostels and common areas to deter ragging incidents.</li> <li>• Decided to collaborate with hostel wardens and ensure their active involvement in preventing and reporting ragging cases.</li> <li>• Proposed the establishment of a dedicated helpline or reporting mechanism to encourage victims and witnesses to report incidents confidentially.</li> </ul>

Facilitating students to contact committee members by providing them with Counseling Cell, Students Mentoring Team and Counseling Psychologist	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Proposed the establishment of a dedicated counseling cell that can provide guidance and support to students who have experienced ragging or witnessed any such incidents.</li> <li>Discussed the formation of a Students Mentoring Team comprising senior students who can act as mentors and guide their juniors.</li> <li>Decided to engage a counseling psychologist who can offer professional assistance to students affected by ragging and provide necessary counseling.</li> </ul>

Workshop to be organized	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Decided to conduct a workshop on ragging awareness for students, faculty, and staff members.</li> <li>Discussed potential resource persons or organizations that can deliver informative sessions on the prevention of ragging.</li> <li>Assigned committee members to coordinate the logistics and scheduling of the workshop.</li> </ul>
