Training helped the faculty and staff member to identify subtle indicators such as changes in behaviour, signs of distress, or unusual student dynamics within their classrooms or around campus. The previous agenda helped faculty and staff member to build positive relationships with students. Students feel connected to their teachers and more likely to trust them and seek help if they experience or witness ragging. Faculty members are collaborating with psychological counsellor to identify students who may be struggling or at risk of experiencing mental health issues related to ragging or other stressors. Discussed to conduct regular awareness programs and workshops to educate students about the negative consequences of ragging. Emphasize the importance of mutual respect and dignity among peers.

- Discussed and decided Strict Policy Implementation with severe consequences for those found guilty. This policy should be widely communicated to all students, staff, and faculty.
- Decided to provide counselling services for both victims and perpetrators of ragging. Victims may require emotional support, while perpetrators may need guidance to understand the impact of their actions. Create peer support groups where senior students can guide and support new students in a positive manner, without resorting to ragging.
- Decided to increase supervision and monitoring in hostel areas, especially during the initial weeks of the academic year when ragging incidents are more likely to occur.
- Discussed to create wider university community, including faculty members, alumni, and parents, in efforts to prevent ragging. Encourage a culture of inclusivity and support.
- Discussed to provide positive rewards initiatives for the students that promote and practice a welcoming and supportive environment in the hostel.
- Decided to take follow-up and evaluation regularly of antiragging measures through surveys, feedback sessions, and incident reports.
