1. Outcome of the action taken of the pervious agenda.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Educating new students about anti-ragging policies increased awareness and understanding. Students felt a stronger sense of belonging and community when they knew that ADTU Campus takes their safety seriously and promotes a harassment-free environment.</li> <li>• New students were more responsible and discourage peers from engaging in ragging, fostering peer accountability.</li> </ul>	
The effects of ragging on students.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Discussed the consequences that a student suffer from ragging and what the impacts are. Students often suffer from severe anxiety and depression which reduce their ability to concentrate, retain information, and perform well academically. ADTU has decided to conduct individual and group counselling session with the psychological counsellor for the well-being of the students.</li> <li>• Discussed how ragging leads to loss of interest in studies. Students may find it challenging to stay motivated or engaged in their coursework.</li> <li>• Discussed and decided to encourage the students by organising more interaction session like boosting self-esteem to get involve in participation in class discussions and group activities.</li> </ul>	

- ADTU has discussed and decided to conduct mandatory orientation sessions for all new students and staff to educate them about the anti-ragging policy, reporting mechanisms, and support services.
- Discussed to use posters, flyers, social media, and university websites to continuously promote anti-ragging messages and information.
- Discussed and decided to ensure regular patrolling by security personnel and faculty members in the ADTU campus where students congregate, especially during break times and late hours.
- Discussed and decided to provide anonymous reporting channels such as online forms, drop boxes to encourage students to report incidents without fear of retaliation.
- Discussed and decided to organize more inclusive and engaging activities such as sports, cultural events, and team-building exercises to foster positive interactions among students.
